| 1. | <u> </u> Peter Waldo | a. Never agreed with the Roman Catholic Church. Despite intense persecution this "Little Flock" worked to share the Bible with others. |
| 2. | <u> </u> The Waldensians | b. Memorized most of the New Testament and large parts of the Old Testament. Taught that Christ is the only sacrifice for sin. |
| 3. | <u> </u> John Wycliffe | c. Wrote an extensive framework of the evangelical Reformed faith and another work concerning the offices of the church. |
| 4. | <u> </u> John Huss | d. Defended the rights of his country against paying tribute to the Papacy. 1st translation of Bible into the English language. |
| 5. | <u> </u> Martin Luther | e. Wrote over 125 hymns. Salvation only in Christ as described in Romans 1:17 "The just shall live by faith." |
| 6. | <u> </u> Ulrich Zwingli | f. Known for his teaching on the universal priesthood of all believers. Encouraged congregational singing during worship. |
| 7. | <u> </u> William Tyndale | g. Taught that faith must come before baptism. Called for Christians to be simple in their manner of living. |
| 8. | <u> </u> John Knox | h. Wrote "Obedience of a Christian Man" which was owned by Anne Boleyn and read by King Henry VIII. Led to Great Bible (1539). |
| 9. | <u> </u> John Calvin | i. Taught that all preaching and teaching must be subjected to the test of Scripture. Spoke against the worship of images. |
| 10. | <u> </u> Menno Simons | j. First translated the Bible into a modern language. This was prior to the printing press. All copies were handwritten. |
